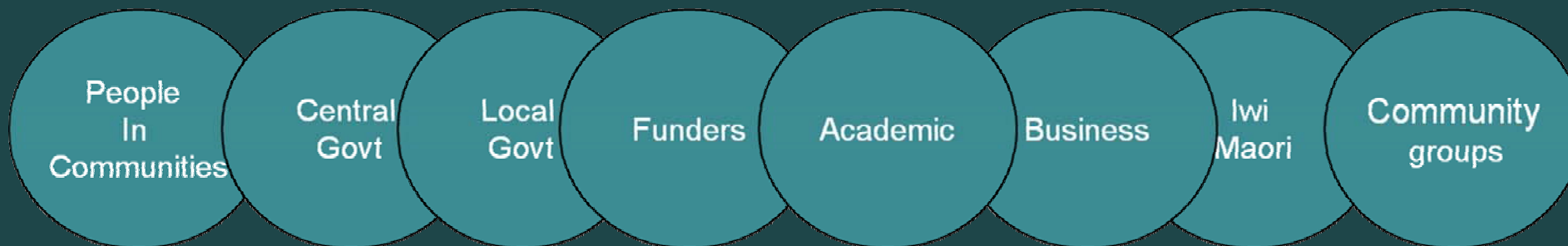

About Community-Led Development...



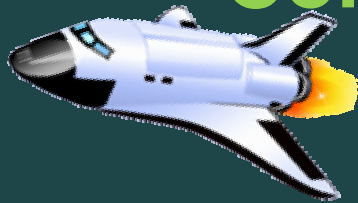
- Place: cross cuts local residents & communities of interest

Simple issues –broad general agreement on the issue and how to address it, with the same ‘generic solution’ applied many times over with a high degree of certainty.

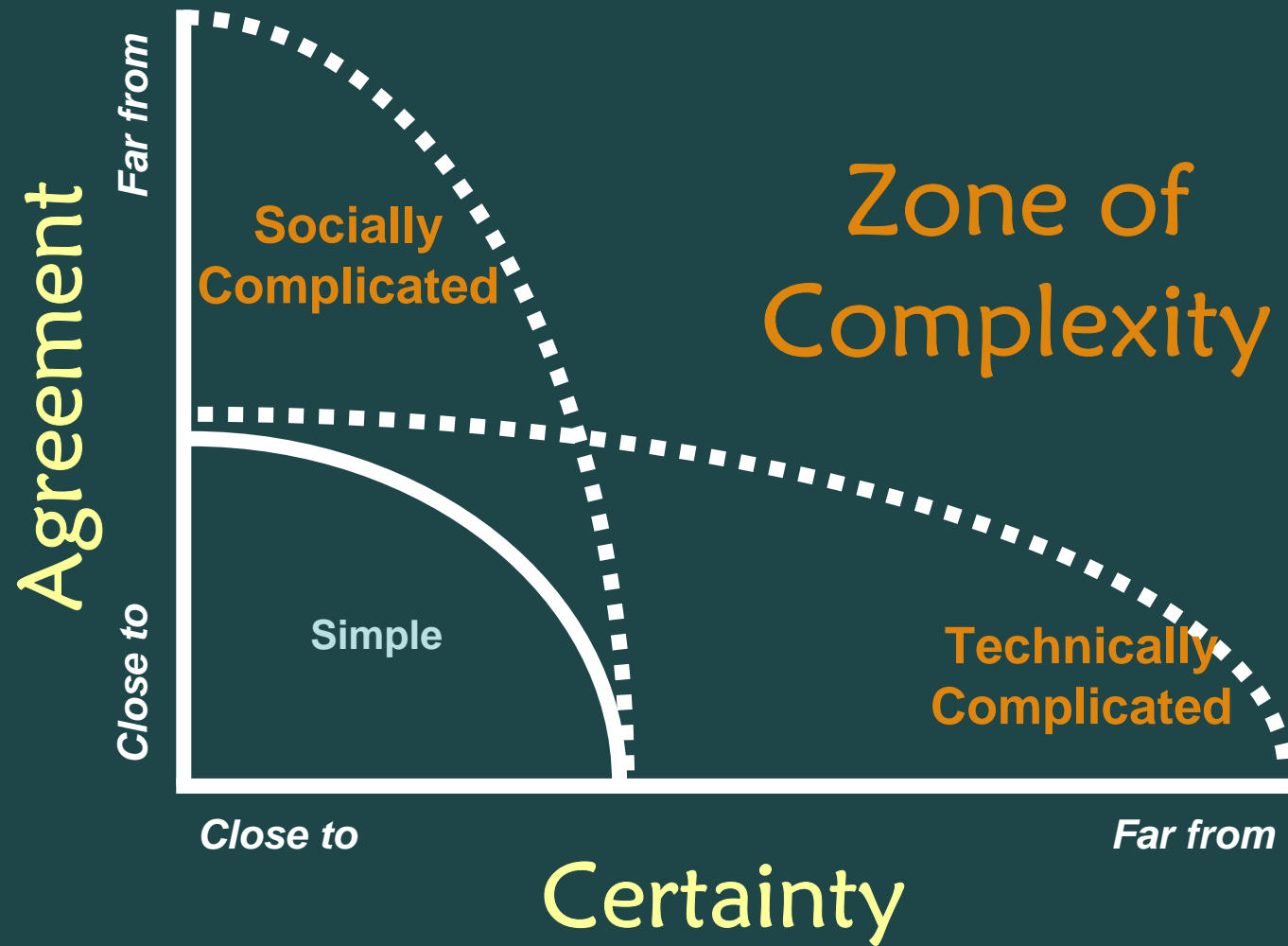


Complicated issues - solutions can be found with some specialist technical assistance.

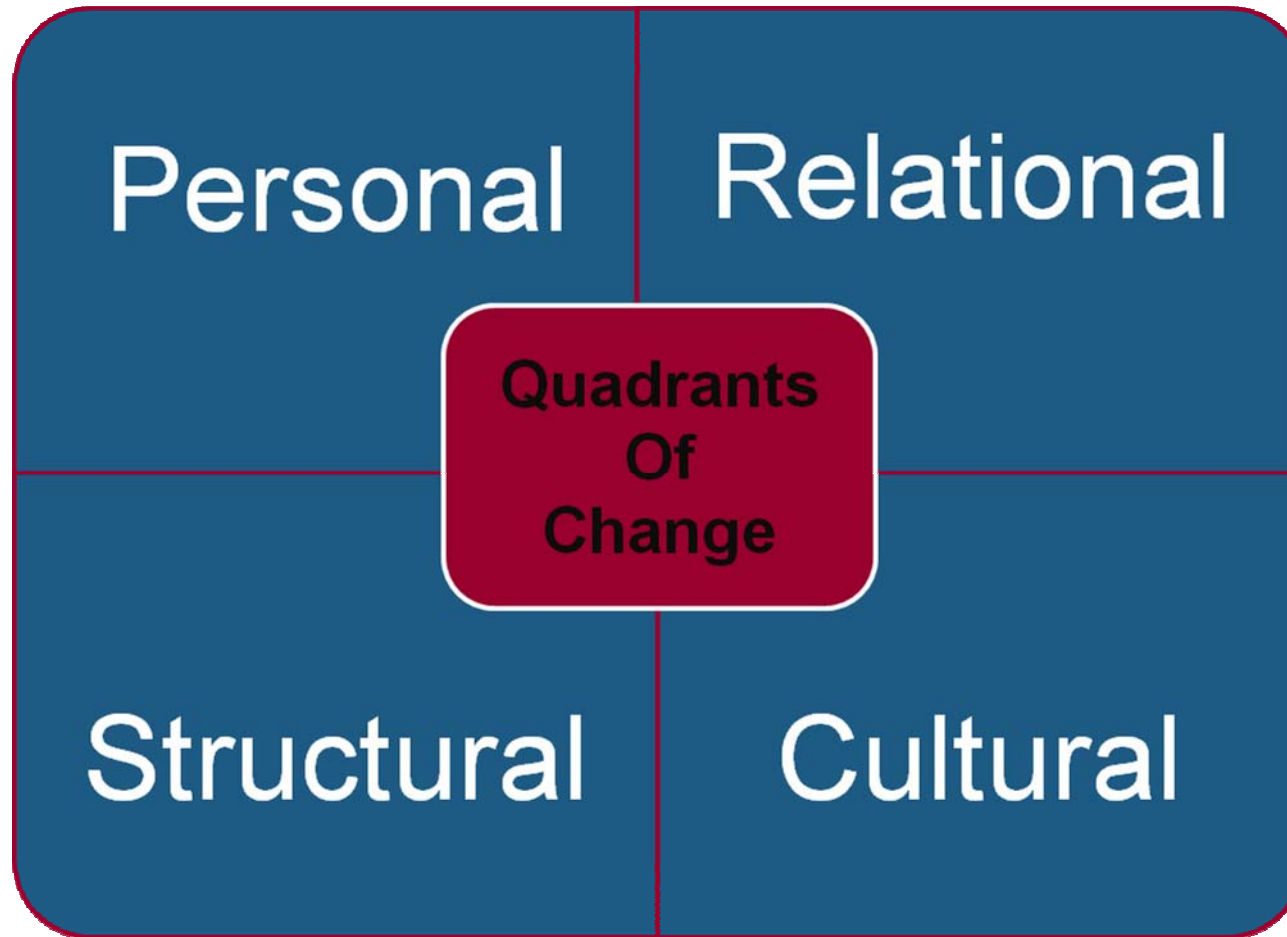


Complex issues - outcomes are far less certain, as is the agreed pathway to success.

- ✘ Whole Systems Change

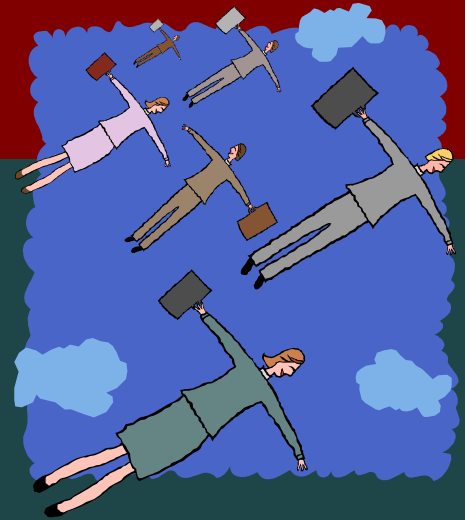

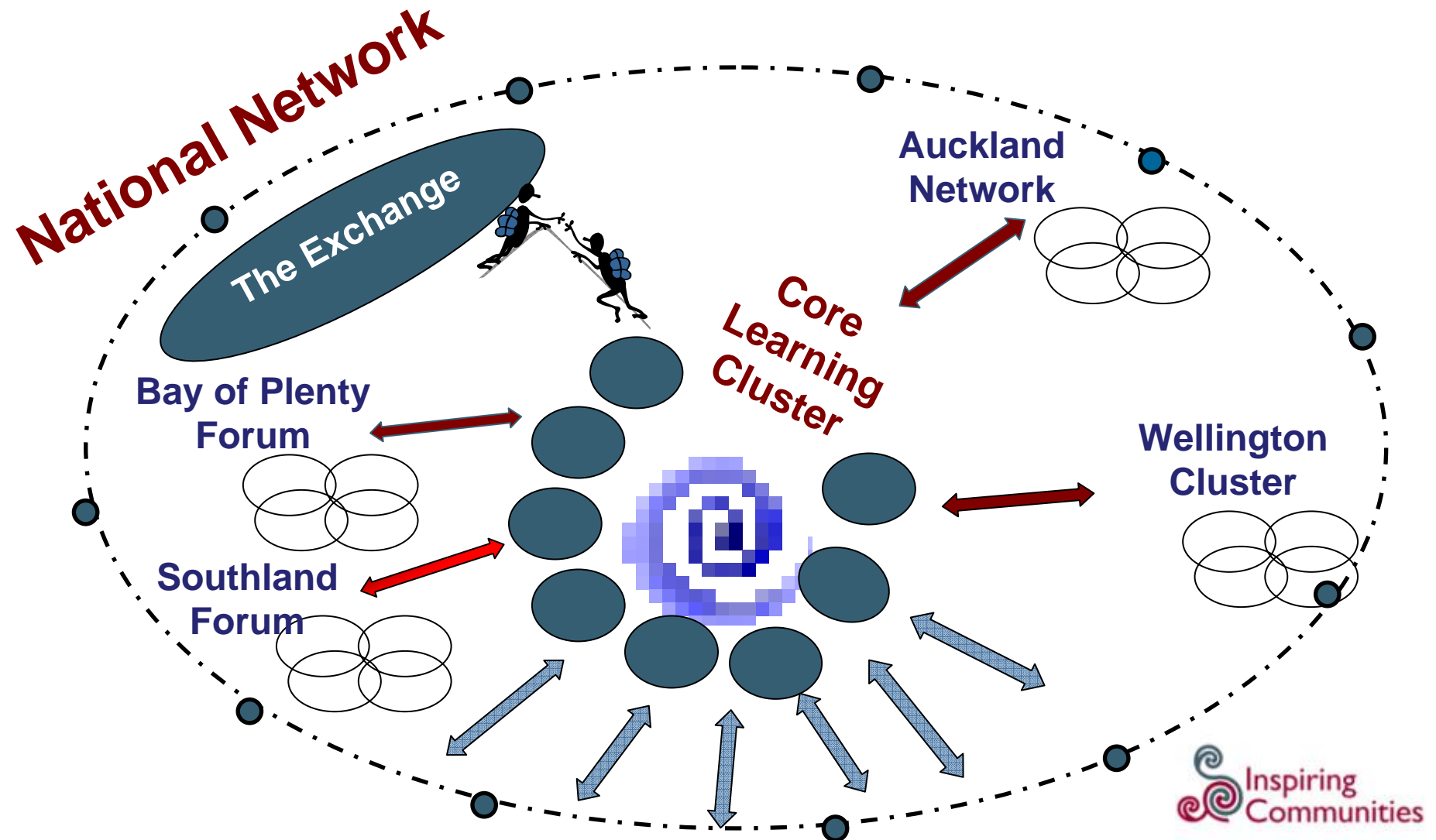
We always work with others

 - Lots of conversations, Canada, decision at end of 2007

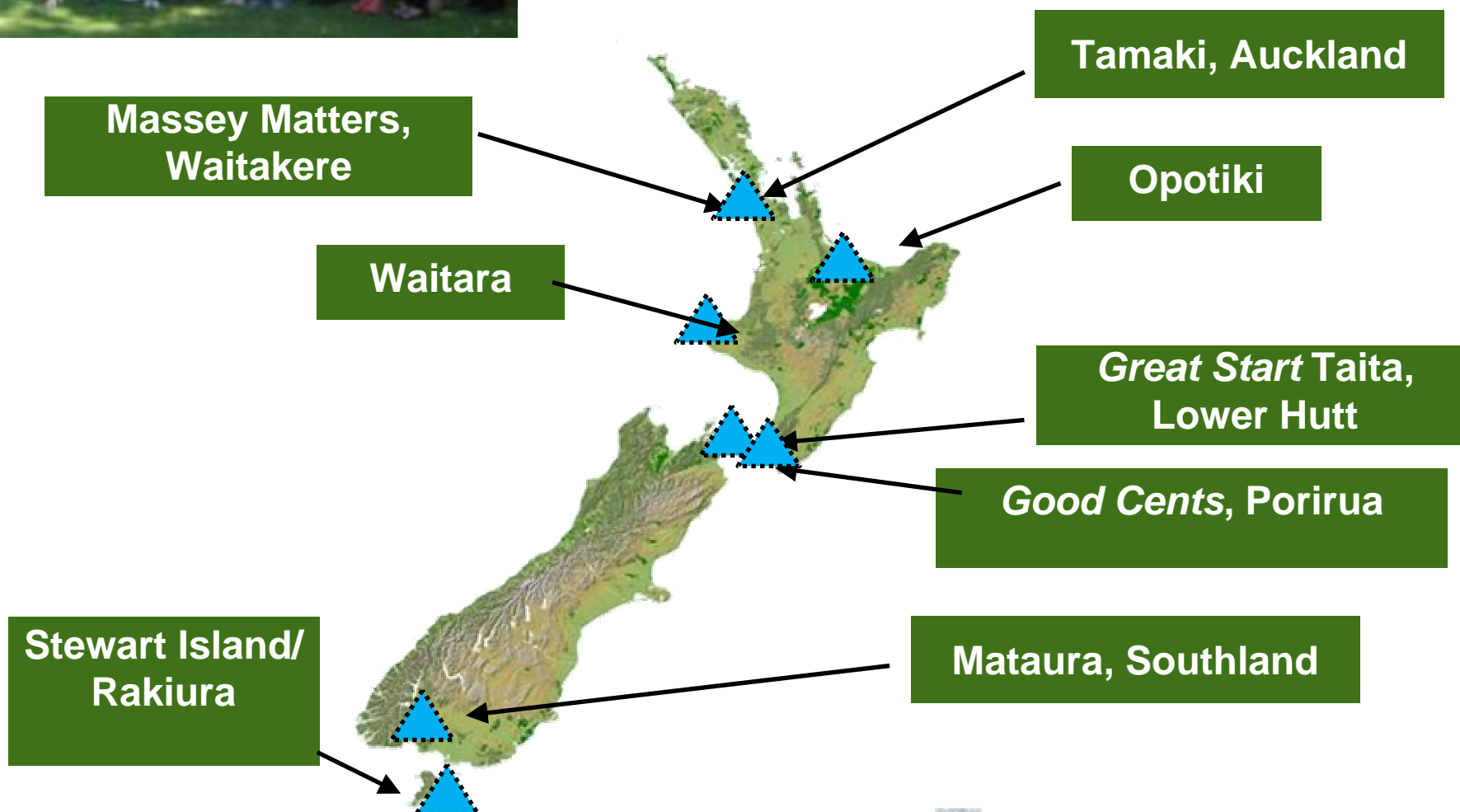


Inspiring Communities Exchange 2010
